**RE: REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS -
SOLICITATION # 0975-14-UA-01W**

Dear Program Administrator:

The United States District Court for the District of Hawaii is soliciting proposals to provide drug detection testing for male and female federal defendants/offenders.

These individuals include persons on probation, supervised release, or parole, who are under supervision of the United States Probation Office. This group also includes inmates in the United States Bureau of Prisons who are residing in federal or contract community treatment centers, as well as persons on Pretrial status under the supervision of the United States Pretrial Services.

The Request For Proposal (RFP) contains the full text of all applicable Government regulations, and all offerors are subject to the provisions contained in the RFP. In responding to the RFP, you should answer fully each item and supply all information requested. Section "L" provides specific directions for potential vendors in completing their proposals. The minimum standards for the services listed are contained in the Clauses and Terms of Agreement, and all proposals will be evaluated by the criterion laid out in Section "M."

Proposals will be awarded on the basis of initial offers submitted, and each initial offer should contain your organization's best terms from a cost and technical standpoint. There will be no additional opportunity to modify your proposal.

Please read the RFP carefully; do not rely on knowledge of previous RFPs, or knowledge of previous federal procurement procedures.

The estimated monthly quantity (EMQ) listed in Section "B" of the RFP is the estimate of the services to be provided during the term of this agreement. It is only an estimate and derived from the average of six months of services billed for both the U.S. Probation and Pretrial Services offices.

Although the Government may choose to enter into a Blanket Purchase Agreement with multiple vendors, the Government reserves the right to award to a single vendor.

The term for this Blanket Purchase Agreement is twelve (12) months, with a provision that shall allow the Government to unilaterally extend the agreement for an additional two (2) years, at two (2) twelve (12) month intervals, at the Government's discretion.

A vendor must be capable of providing all services identified in Section "B," and within the geographic area identified in Section "B."

All questions regarding the RFP must be submitted in writing to the U.S. Probation Office by August 8, 2013 to Lisa K.T. Jicha via fax number (808) 541-1345 or email address POLJicha@hip.uscourts.gov. Responses will be sent out to all vendors who requested an RFP by August 15, 2013.

The RFP is accessible for download at www.hipt.uscourts.gov. If you are unable to download the RFP, please contact Lisa K.T. Jicha at (808) 541-1315 for a copy.

For all proposals, an original and one (1) copy must be received no later than 4:00 p.m. on August 30, 2013, at 300 Ala Moana Blvd., Room 2300, Honolulu, Hawaii 96850. **Please do not resubmit a blank copy of the RFP** with the proposal.

All copies must be originally signed. A copy of the Blanket Purchase Agreement, Clauses and Terms of Agreement, should be retained by the vendor for their files. **Please do not submit proposals in binders or notebooks.**

In your review of the RFP requirements, the following clarifications are offered:

Project Code (PC) 1011 - Urine Collection/Non-Instrumented Drug Testing (NIDT) Devices Testing and 1504 - Breathalyzer: The vendor must operate a code-a-phone system for random testing and must have the ability to test seven (7) days a week, to include holidays. The testing period must include time periods before or after traditional working hours of 7:30am-4:30pm. For example, testing will occur during the hours of 5am-7:30am and/or between 4:30pm-8:30pm. The testing time periods shall be approved by the U.S. Probation Office. The monthly testing schedule must be submitted prior to the start of each month. The schedule shall include one weekend or holiday testing date per month. The vendor will utilize a refractometer supplied by the U.S. Probation Office to confirm a urine specimen is valid and not dilute prior to the


submission of the specimen to the laboratory. Any urine specimen with a specific gravity reading below 1.003 will be considered dilute and the defendant/offender will be required to submit an additional urine sample if time permits. If time is not sufficient for the collection of an additional specimen, the defendant/offender will be notified to report to the respective supervising office on the next business day. The vendor shall provide notification of defendant/offender's failure to submit a valid specimen within 24 hours.

According to the Department of Labor, the wage determination for a urine collector is classified under the occupational code titles of Medical Assistant (#12100) and Medical Laboratory Technician (#12130), entailing a minimum wage rate of \$14.83 and \$19.74, respectively. The wage determination form is included in the RFP packet.

Please note the **Local Needs section** for the modification to the Description/Statement of Work pertaining to substance abuse drug testing.

Please note that federal clients are to receive priority placement in the treatment programs and a contractor's ability to discharge a federal client without the involvement of the Probation or Pretrial Services Officer is limited.
